

MENDING



A process in which weaving imperfections, such as tears, broken yarns, tight spots and similar defects, are repaired with a needle.

For woolen felt, this means 150 working hours.

This task requires particular attention as one simple defect on a 30m long felt for example can make a hole in the paper every 30 metres.

Once this stage has been completed, the felt is placed on the perch in order to carry out a final inspection.

It is then laid on the floor in order to put it into a balloon shape for stitching and to make assembly easier on to the furnace where it must be heat-set.
