## Quilling



This process is the preparation of the weft threads, and is completed in the form of pirns/quills (cylindrical or slightly tapered support on which yarn is wound)

The pirn or quill is then placed in the shuttle. The latter being the boatshaped device that carries the weft yarns through the warp yarn in a backand-forth motion.

The diametre of the threads can vary depending on the products that are to be woven.

There are different machines to do this operation.
